Statement of Exemption Based on Offering Religious Disciplines

Chapter 7.9 of Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board rules outlines exemption provisions for religious institutions offering degrees, whether in person or via distance education, in religious disciplines.

In *H.E.B. Ministries v. Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board*, 235 S.W.3d 627 (2007), the Texas Supreme Court held that sections 61.304 and 61.313(a) of the Texas Education Code, which regulate the activities of degree-granting institutions, may not constitutionally be "applied to a religious institution's program of religious instruction."

Provided an institution's activities are entirely religious in nature, they are outside the purview of the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board and no approval is required.

If a religious institution would like to offer a degree program or courses leading to a degree in a non-religious discipline, the institution must follow the requirements in Coordinating Board Rules Chapter 7.7 relating to institutions accredited by Board recognized accreditors or Chapter 7.8 relating to institutions not accredited by a Board recognized accreditor.

Accreditation

What is Accreditation?

Accreditation is a voluntary process by which primary and secondary schools, colleges, universities, and professional schools submit themselves to a comprehensive review process by an outside agency to ensure quality and institutional integrity. A.R.M.O.R. Center School Of Ministry (ACSM) operates in the State of Texas as a Religious School offering only Christian (religious) degrees in Biblical, Ministry and Theology Studies.

Accreditation is basically an organized way of determining the acceptance of credits or degrees from any particular institution. This process is extremely expensive and does not make quality education any better. Since academic recognition is a continual process, the ACSM administration has made a commitment to provide the highest quality standards of education without compromise, to the Biblical and theological philosophies of Christianity and without any government interference. Please note that this approach to accreditation is uniquely American as most universities outside of the United States are under a government charter or approval.

Is It Really Necessary to attend a regionally Accredited School for you?

It all depends! If you are pursuing a college degree through a Christian school for the purpose of seeking employment in the secular world, then our advice to you is to seek elsewhere. On the other hand, if you are seeking a degree from a Christian school for the purpose of perfecting your ministry, your church body, then ACSM is the place for you. You do not need an accredited degree to be an effective leader in fulfilling the great commission. Mission

Inspired by the belief that A.R.M.O.R. Center School Of Ministry (ACSM) exists to provide the necessary Biblical experience to prepare committed Christians to walk closely with God, to effectively share their faith and to serve in a Christ like manner in whatever office the LORD may lead them. ACSM herby establishes the Mission of providing Christian education to capable, serious, mature and motivated students with the intent of equipping them to become leaders in their Christian life and profession.

To this end, ACSM will maintain the faculty and support structure necessary to assist its students in developing and enhancing their capabilities, skills and effectiveness in their chosen profession. The focus of the Institution's program will be academically sound, flexible in delivery, designed and offered to meet the needs of full and part-time students from the regional, national and international communities.

The Institution is committed to Christian education and research, and will support and encourage its faculty and students in Christian and intellectual pursuits.

General Information When To Enroll

Students may enroll in A.R.M.O.R. Center School Of Ministry (ACSM) Distance Education Program at any time throughout the year.

All students that desire to enroll in the A.R.M.O.R. Center School Of Ministry (ACSM) in school program must first submit an enrollment application prior to the beginning of the school semester. All late enrollees must be capable of making up class work to meet up with the current classes.

Admissions And Registration

A.R.M.O.R. Center School of Ministry admits students of any race, national, or ethnic origin, color, sex, age, handicap or religious preference in its educational programs and activities as required by the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and Amendments including Title IX of the Educational Amendments of 1972. Students admitted into degree level studies must hold or acquire a high school diploma or its equivalent. A baccalaureate degree is required to enter the graduate division programs.

Persons desiring to enroll in A.R.M.O.R. Center School Of Ministry (ACSM), undergraduate or graduate programs must make application to the Office of Admissions. All applicants must submit a complete application along with transcripts and fees. It is the applicant's responsibility to contact schools previously attended to have official transcripts sent or included with the application. No application will be considered until all necessary information has been submitted.

Important Notice

Upon the completion of evaluation by A.R.M.O.R. Center School Of Ministry (ACSM) Admission, a letter will be forwarded to the applicant informing him/her of their standing. If applicant is accepted for studies, A.R.M.O.R. Center School Of Ministry (ACSM) will keep the application active for three (3) months. If the prospective student does not enroll within that time limit, all records will be destroyed. Should the prospective student wish to enroll after that time frame, he/she will be required to submit a new application along with all documentation fees.

Transfer Credit

Students who wish to transfer credit of previous academic work must submit official transcripts at the time of enrollment. Only courses of "C" or above will be considered if they meet the criteria for the student's program of study at A.R.M.O.R. Center School Of Ministry (ACSM).

Graduation

Degrees are awarded throughout the year for all Distance Education Programs. All in school graduation services and degree awards are awarded in May of each academic year. It is recommended that students participate in the graduation exercise if at all possible.

Academics

A.R.M.O.R. Center School Of Ministry (ACSM) courses are based on the semester hour system. All courses carry a minimum of three (3) hours of credit unless otherwise indicated in the catalog. External students may enroll in the Distance Education Program at anytime during the year.

Grading System

Work at A.R.M.O.R. Center School Of Ministry (ACSM) is assigned letter grades based on percentage point and assigned quality points as outlined below.

A student must repeat any course in which he/she received a grade of 69 or below. Students enrolled in the Distance Education Program work at their own rate. It is suggested; however, that each individual course be completed within a twelve week period in order to keep the student motivated in his/her education pursuits. Additional time may be granted by the Dean of Academic Affairs in the extreme circumstances. The grading system for students in the Distance Education Program is the same as resident students.

The grade point average (GPA) is determined by dividing the quality points earned by the semester hours completed. GPA is calculated on credit hours; however, additional points are accredited to resident students who participate in the training sessions. Additional points may be awarded to Distance Education students who provide additional written course summaries. All summaries for the undergraduate program must be a minimum of 1500 words and submitted in Word or PDF form. All summaries for the graduate program must be a minimum of 2500 words and submitted in Word or PDF form.

Confidentiality Of Student Records

A.R.M.O.R. Center School Of Ministry (ACSM), in compliance with the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act Of 1974, will maintain all records in accordance with the act as amended. A student's file will be open to him/her, but not to another person without his/her written consent, with the exception of the official faculty and staff members of the Institute who have professional right to the material.

Scholastic Standing

Students in the undergraduate program who have GPA's below 2.0 in any twelve hours of work will be placed on academic probation. Any graduate students who have a GPA below 3.0 in any twelve hours of work will be placed on academic probation. The student will be given a twenty-four week period for the raising of his/her GPA to the required figure. Each student may receive academic and personal counseling through the Student Mentor Program to ensure the maximum opportunity for academic success during this period of time. A student who fails to improve his/her GPA within this period will be academically dismissed from ACSM for twelve weeks. The student may reapply for admissions and, if accepted will be on probation for the first twelve weeks after readmission. If during the twelve weeks, the student fails to maintain his/her GPA of 2.0, 3.0 or 3.2 he/she shall be permanently dismissed from ACSM.

Student Classification

Freshman: A student who has earned up to 30 semester hours. Sophomore: A student who has earned 31-60 semester hours. Junior: A student who has earned 61-90 semester hours. Senior: A student who earned 91-120 semester hours.

Graduate: A student who has been accepted into the Master's Program.

Post Graduate: A student who has been accepted into the Doctoral Program or above.

Student Mentor Program

Each student enrolled in a program at A.R.M.O.R. Center School Of Ministry (ACSM) will have available someone to advise them when the need arises. The student, along with a member of the administration, will select a program of study that is outlined in the catalog.

Transcripts

One unofficial transcript will be given to the student. One official transcript will be sent at his/her written request to another institute at a fee of \$10.00. Any additional transcripts requested will be assessed a fee of \$10.00 each. No transcripts will be issued to, or for a student who has failed to meet all financial obligations.

Personalized Study Plans

It is the policy of A.R.M.O.R. Center School Of Ministry (ACSM) to assist in the selection of an individual plan of study for each student. Our faculty believes that each individual is a creation of God designed for a specific purpose, and to best fulfill that purpose they need studies designed to meet their goals and needs. For this reason students at the institute are treated in a different manner than at most schools. Through a program of testing, life experience, resume, portfolio and academic review, the student's program of study is selected. The student's program of study may be modified at specific points (as per the student's academic contract) to accommodate possible changes of goals and needs. For information concerning specific programs of study please contact the Dean of Academic Affairs Office.

Academic Review Board

This is a board of qualified faculty members and outside specialists in several fields of study. Their main purpose is to assist in the selection of curriculum that will be used by each student throughout their program of study.

Life Credit

The faculty of A.R.M.O.R. Center School Of Ministry (ACSM) recognizes that Life Experience is important to the applying student. ACSM will issues credit for applicable, documented work experience. Such credits are awarded by the Academic Review Board, and may not exceed 25% of the requirements of a program of study. These credits will be applicable only to programs at the Associate and Bachelor level. (See Life Experience Application that is enclosed.) All Life Experience credits are determined via the Academic Portfolio process.

Diploma Programs

It is the policy of ACSM to offer a diploma for the completion of each program taken in the General Bible Diploma Program or not covered in one of the degree programs.

ACSM faculty has designated all of our programs as: "Theological" study programs whether or not they are diploma or degree related.

General Bible Diploma, Discipleship & Ministerial Training Programs.

To enroll in this program the student must have a great desire for knowing more about God and His purpose for life. This is a one year program of study that takes 30 hours/credit to complete. These are usually broken down into: Church History, Old and New Testament Survey, Bible Doctrine, and the Life of Christ. The exact courses may be chosen by the Review Process, or a standardized curriculum that is available. A Discipleship Training Certificate will be awarded for satisfactory completion of the required study.

Undergraduate Degree Programs "1 to 4 year programs of study, of 30 to 120 hours".

It is the policy of ACSM to offer a degree for the completion of each level taken in the Undergraduate Degree Program. The ACSM faculty has designated all of our programs as: "Theological" study programs.

Declared Majors

All programs of studies at A.R.M.O.R. Center School Of Ministry (ACSM) are religious fields of study. At this time ACSM has only one concentration for the Associate and Bachelor degree that is in the field of Biblical Studies.

Majors in the Master and Doctoral Programs are limited to Biblical Studies, Ministry and Theology. To properly facilitate the program of study "majors must be declared at the time of enrollment". Should a student desire to make a change at a latter date this may be facilitated with the approval of the Dean of Academic Affairs.

Associate Level Degree Program

These programs require the completion of 60 hours/credits, the equivalent of two years of academic work for completion. These will be in a standardized program of study. To enroll in this program applicant must have completed a high school diploma or its equivalent. There is only one major offered at this time, a major in Biblical Studies.

Bachelor Level Degree Program

To enroll in a Bachelor Program the applicant must have a high school diploma, or its equivalent. To complete a Bachelor's lever program 120 hours/credits of academic work are required. There is only one major offered at this time, a major in Biblical Studies.

Graduate Level Degree Programs

These programs require the completion of 33 to 66 hours/credits, the equivalent of one to two years.

Master Level Degree Programs

To enroll in Master Degree Program applicants must have completed a Bachelor Degree. All students enrolling in a Master program must declare a major prior to enrollment. All Master programs are designed for the specific student goals.

The Master Programs are: Biblical Studies, Ministry and Theology. Each program has specific credit hour requirements for completion. Most require 32 to 45 credit hours to complete. Most programs have an option for the writing of thesis. Check catalogue for requirements. Those choosing thesis options must submit topic for approval by the graduate committee. For additional information about a specific program contact the Office of the Dean of Academic Affairs.

Doctoral Level Programs

To enroll in Doctoral Degree Program applicants must have completed a Master Degree. All students enrolling in a Doctoral program must declare a major prior to enrollment. All Doctoral programs are core specific, and each program is very intensive. Research and writing of a dissertation are major portions of all doctoral level programs. The programs of studies are: Biblical Studies, Ministry and Theology.

Students enrolled in doctoral programs are presumed to have the ability to study independently, yet will receive the assistance from staff when necessary. Each program has specific credit hour requirements for completion. Most require 45 to 64 credit hours above the Master level to complete. All topics for the dissertation must be approved by the graduate committee. For information about a specific program of study contact the Office of the Dean of Academic Affairs.

Graduation Requirements

Associate Degree

The student must:

- 1. Complete at least 60 credit hours; including the courses required for his/her degree. 15 credit hours must be completed through or verified by ACSM.
- 2. Receive at least a "C" in all courses required in his/her major field.
- 3. Earn a 2.0 GPA on studies at A.R.M.O.R. Center School of Ministry (ACSM).
- 4. Complete the Petition for Graduation in the Admission and Records Office by the end of the trimester of anticipated graduation.
- 5. Settle all financial obligations to the school of ministry.
- 6. Attend the commencement activities if at all possible.

Bachelor Degree

The student must:

- 1. Complete at least 120 credit hours; including the courses required for his/her degree. 30 credit hours must be completed through or verified by ACSM.
- 2. Receive at least a "C" in all courses required in his/her major field.
- 3. Earn a 2.0 GPA on studies at A.R.M.O.R. Center School of Ministry (ACSM).
- 4. Complete the Petition for Graduation in the Admission and Records Office by the end of the trimester of anticipated graduation.
- 5. Settle all financial obligations to the school of ministry.
- 6. Attend the commencement activities if at all possible.

Master Degree

The student must:

- 1. Complete 33 to 45 graduate credit hours depending on the degree in which one is enrolled. In the 33 credit hour program credit hours must be completed or verified by ACSM.
- 2. Receive at least a "B" in all courses required in his/her major field.
- 3. Earn a 3.0 GPA on studies at A.R.M.O.R. Center School of Ministry (ACSM).
- 4. Complete the Petition for Graduation in the Admission and Records Office by the end of the trimester of anticipated graduation.
- 5. Settle all financial obligations to the school of ministry.
- 6. Attend the commencement activities if at all possible.

Doctoral Program

The student must:

- 1. Complete 45 to 64 graduate credit hours depending on the degree in which one is enrolled. All credit hours for these programs must be completed or verified by ACSM.
- 2. Receive at least a "B" in all courses required in his/her major field.
- 3. Earn a 3.2 GPA on studies at A.R.M.O.R. Center School of Ministry (ACSM).
- 4. Complete the Petition for Graduation in the Admission and Records Office by the end of the trimester of anticipated graduation.
- 5. Settle all financial obligations to the school of ministry.
- 6. Attend the commencement activities if at all possible.

Academic Fees

GENERAL BIBLE DIPLOMA PROGRAM & DISCIPLESHIP TRAINING PROGRAM

The General Bible Diploma Program has been developed with several levels of Biblical concentration. The first tier in the diploma series is the "New Life" which is a great approach to establishing the foundations of life in Christ. PRERESQUITE

MINISTERIAL TRAINING PROGRAM

The Ministerial Training Program is designed to equip ministerial candidate with a working knowledge of Bible Theology. This program is built around courses in Bible interpretation and preparation for Pastoral/Evangelistic Ministry. Students applying for the Ministerial Program are encouraged to posses or have received a high school diploma or its equivalent.

Students who have completed the study requirements can apply to A.R.M.O.R. Center Ministries for ministry license. Licenses can be obtained at three levels.

(1) Exhorters (2) Licensed Minister (3) Ordained Minister

The beginning licensure designated as "Exhorter" requires eight modules or verifiable life experience equivalent. Each level of licensure builds upon the previous requirements or verified equivalent. (Courses may be altered upon review and discretion of the school board)

ASSOCIATE AND BACHELOR OF BIBLICAL STUDIES

PRERESQUITE

Students in the Associates or Bachelor of Biblical Studies must have completed and received a high school diploma or its equivalent. To receive the Associate or Bachelor Degree the student must complete 60 semester hours for the Associate and 120 hours for the Bachelors in a specified program. A Diploma of Biblical Studies will be awarded to any student who does not possess a high school diploma in place of a degree.
